
Turn in your Annual Reports!

Pastor's Page

"When you pray, pray like this... 'Give us this day our daily bread.'" (Luke 11:2-3)

Greetings in Christ St. Luke Lutheran Church,

By the time you read this newsletter article we'll be past our Christmas celebrations stumbling our way into a new year. We will all be one year older, an experience some of us will meet with joy and others of us with fear and trepidation. We will all be one year wiser—or one year more aware of our foolishness—either because of lessons learned the hard way last year, or lessons learned in more gentle ways. We may be a year richer, or a year poorer. We may enter the new year happy & brimming with hope, or fearful of what is to come. More than likely, we'll meet the new year as a combination of all these things. What is true for all of us is this: If you're reading this, God has given you the grace to walk into *one more year*.

Our temptation then, as they say, is to "make the most out of this new year!" Buy that gym membership, read those books, go for that promotion, don't miss your kids' sporting events, plan that vacation, save, spend, do all the things. Make this new year full so that when you're reflecting on it at the end of next year, you look back with joy, not regret, and forward with hope, not despair. That's a lot of pressure to put on a new year.

I'm reminded of one of the most help pieces of advice Jesus ever gave us regarding prayer. He said, "When you pray, pray like this...'Give us this day our daily bread." How appropriate at the close of one year, and the beginning of another, that these words should ring in our heads. To the temptation to look backward with either too much regret or too much pride they say, "Give us this day our daily bread." To the temptation to look forward with either naive hope or faithless despair they tell us, "Give us this day our daily bread." To anyone who needs permission to avoid the constant cultural pull to park heart and minds in the past or the future, they remind us that Jesus never pulls us in those directions. Jesus told to park our minds here, "Give us this day our daily bread."

Jesus seemed to live with this firm faith that whatever He needed, God would provide. Does that allow us the audacity to say to those regrets from the past, "Maybe I didn't need that?" Yes, I think it does. Does that allow us to say to the temptation to do "all the things" in the future, "Maybe I don't need to do that." Yes, I think it does. Does that allow us to NOT grasp hold of life in 365-day chunks but simply love the people God puts in our path, use the gifts available at this moment, forgo the gifts unavailable in this moment, and leave dreaming or dreading aside in order to simply recognize that in a lot of ways we have enough, right now? Yes, I think it does.

It'd be fun to live for a whole year, honestly, not thinking about a *whole year*. The world may not give us permission to live like that, but Jesus does, and we're followers of Jesus, not culture. Who knows what next year will bring? Who cares? Jesus never told us to worry about next year. He said, "Give us this day our daily bread." Let's start with daily bread and see what God does from there.




