Pastor's Page

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all that I have commanded you; and truly I am with you until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Greetings in Christ St. Luke Lutheran Church,

The verse above is known as the Great Commission. The Risen Jesus speaks these words to his disciples just before He ascends to heaven. Many have interpreted these words as a "passing of the gauntlet" so to speak. That is, Jesus handing over his ministry to his followers. Truly, this couldn't be farther from the truth. I don't know about you, but I have no interest in doing ministry *without* Jesus, or *for* Jesus, or *instead* of Jesus. He's either a part of it or I'm out. The promise in the verse is not that Jesus is handing his ministry over, it's that he's inviting his followers into ministry with him in a new way. He promises He will continue to minister with them, "*truly I am with you until the end of the age.*" The disciples soon discover that this new way includes the sending of the Holy Spirit, it includes gifts of healing and prophecy from Jesus they didn't have before, it includes Jesus calling new leaders & disciples into their ranks as the church grows after Pentecost. In short, the disciples move forward in faith because they continue to move forward *with Jesus*.

St. Luke continues to move forward in faith with Jesus as well. As mentioned at our annual meeting in January, St. Luke is embarking on our second capital campaign starting this spring. The goal of our campaign will be to continue servicing the mortgage on our new building, and pay down principle. We hope you'll join us! Our campaign launches on March 16th. Similar to our first capital campaign, we'll invite the members and friends at St. Luke to consider pledging a 3-year gift to our building fund (Forward In Faith Fund) outside of regular giving to the general fund. Our new building has increased our ability to be a church of hope and help in Goodhue. Let's keep stewarding our mission well.

We invite you to sit down with your family and talk about a 3-year pledge. Between March 16th and May 4th, you'll be receiving phone calls from our capital campaign team inviting pledges, as well as a letter in the mail with a pledge card enclosed. Feel free to bring the pledge card to the office any time you are able. May 4th will be "Commitment Sunday" for our campaign. On May 4th, anybody who has not submitted a pledge card will be welcomed to put a card in the offering plate. On that day, we'll be praying for all pledges as our commitment to steward our new spaces for the mission entrusted to us continues to unfold.

As we move forward in faith, let us continue asking ourselves, "How am I called to participate?" We invite you to consider how Jesus is asking you to step out in mission with us. And remember, whatever we do, we don't do it *for* Jesus or *instead of* Jesus. We do it *with* Jesus, for Jesus promised, "Truly I am with you, even until the end of the age" Let's move forward in faith together,

This is the information written in St. Luke's memorial book from 1953 to 1954.
St. Luke Evangelical Lutheran Church History

In memory of the members who gave their pledges gifts and donations to make St. Luke's Evangelical Church of Goodhue what it is today.

First, let us not forget the pioneers of the church who had the desire, foresight and determination to organize the parish and build the original church. The charter members were K. L. Anderson, Hein Prigge, John Boxrud, Henry Holst, Wm. Hennings, Fred Meyer, Wm Kurchinsky, John Shafer, F.W. Alms and Ole Holte. The organization took place January 8th 1897 and the first service was held January 14th upstairs in what is known as the K. L. Anderson building.

The present building (308 First Ave) was erected in the years of 1898 and 1899. The steeple was added in 1908. The Luther League of St. Luke's Church presented the bell for the belfry. In 1914. The basement was dug out and one room finished. In 1937. The 40th anniversary of the church was celebrated with appropriate services. In June 1947 the 50th or the Gold and jubilee was celebrated in the Goodhue School. The Rev. Paul L. Roth was pastor at the time and the first resident pastor, the Rev. Merrill Boulton and his wife were also present.

It was during this time that the decision to create a building fund with which to enlarge and remodel. Both the church proper and the basement were made. A little over \$4,000 was pledged by the members to start the project. The work was started in the spring of 1951 and completed in 1952. A great deal of Labor was donated by members of the parish. The basement, which was finished first was dedicated in the fall of 1951 and the church proper in the spring of 1952, to which many former members were invited.

The following memorials have been given by members of the church both before and since the Church was remodeled. The vases on the altar by Mr. And Mrs. Albert Schafer in memory of their son Willis Schafer. That baptismal font by Mrs. E. R. Stemman, The missal stand in memory of Mr. & Mrs. P. C. Olson by their children, also other memorials. Several hymnals in memory of Mrs. Hein Prigge by her family. The Dossal curtain in memory of Mrs. John Schafer by her family. The Blue spruce tree on the southwest corner of the church lawn was given in memory of Mr. & Mrs. Nels Nelson by their children. The Rev. and Mrs. Spann and Mr. & Mrs. Wesley Schafer sponsored the refinishing of the altar cross. The kitchen was a project of the women of the church and many furnishings and cash was given by all the church members at the annual fall birthday party. Too long tablecloths were given by Mr. Haga and Mr. Husbyn. Material for 4 tables was donated by Mr. & Mrs. Carl Olson, Mr. & Mrs. Richard Schafer Mr. & Mrs. Harold Hodadson, Mrs. Stanley Johnson and Mrs. William Hennings. The labor furnished by Wesley Schafer. The women of the church received cash memorials from the German girls and Mrs. Fred O'Gorman in memory of their mothers to be used for church furnishings. Chairs were given by Mr. H. H. Diercks, Mr. & Mrs. Gust Buck, Mr. & Mrs. Walter Hinsch and Mr. & Mrs. Martin Kindseth the Ladies aid and Wesley Schafer gave the shrubs in front of the church and around the steeple. The tree planting on the church lawn in memory of Mr. & Mrs. John Schafer. The altar in the basement was given by Dr. James Halverson and Mr. Haga. The kindergarten table and the secretary chair was given by Dr. James Halverson. The piano in the church proper by Mrs. Haga. The coat racks in the basement by O. M. Haga and Mr. Ebe. A number of hymnals were presented in memory of Mr. And Mrs. John Stemman by their grandchildren LaVonne Buck, Dale Buck and Mr. & Mrs. Calvin Buck and Mr. & Mrs. Bernard Bartel. The center stained glass window of Christ the Good Shepherd was given on memory of Mrs. A.M.Haga by her family. Many additional memorials by members and friends also made possible the Matthew window in the memory of Mrs. Haga. The Mark window was given in memory of Mr. Clarence. Goodsell and Mr. Albert Johnson by their wives. An anonymous member also contributed to make this window possible. Other colored windows were donated in memory of Mr. & Mrs. John Schafer, Mr. & Mrs. William Hennings and Mr. & Mrs. William German. sIn the spring of 1958 a Conn electric organ was purchased by the parish. About half. The cost of the organ was given in memorials for those who have passed on and the remainder was donated by the members of the St. Luke parish. The organ was dedicated by Pastor Livers on Sunday, June 29th 1958 at the morning service.

Getting to know our members! Ebner Family's Interview for St. Luke

He also was a big part of getting the fishing club started, which has now grown immensely, teaching many area youth the ins and outs of fishing. Jacki stays extremely busy at school tending to all the tech needs as the Tech Specialist, and providing many fun opportunities for youth and adults as the Community Education Supervisor.

Not only do they give much of their time to the school and people in the Goodhue community, but within our church community, as well. Jacki wears the hat of being our fearless leader, facilitating the Christian Care Team with creativity and grace, and also helps keep all spaces in the church building spic and span!

What began with drive-in church services during COVID, turned into so much more. Attending St. Luke felt comfortable and welcoming immediately. "It just felt right." Both boys loved it, too, often asking when they could go back to church! Knowing their own parents played such a large role in developing their faith, it was important to both Robby and Jacki to attend a church that not only gave them a sense of peace, but created that safe space and growth opportunities for their kids, as well.

Something they love about St. Luke is the people in it. The boys love the older kids. Robby and Jacki feel a testament to St. Luke is the youth who take the younger kids under their wings and fit them right into the various activities. As parents, both Robby and Jacki value having great role models with a strong sense of faith as leaders for the boys.

All being said, church doesn't feel like just a building or a place to hang out on Sunday's for them. The people in it have become family and the relationships and fellowship have been what keeps them connected. They look forward to continuing their faith journey for years to come here at St. Luke.

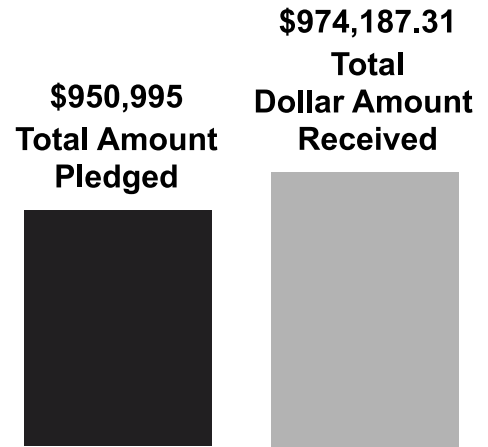

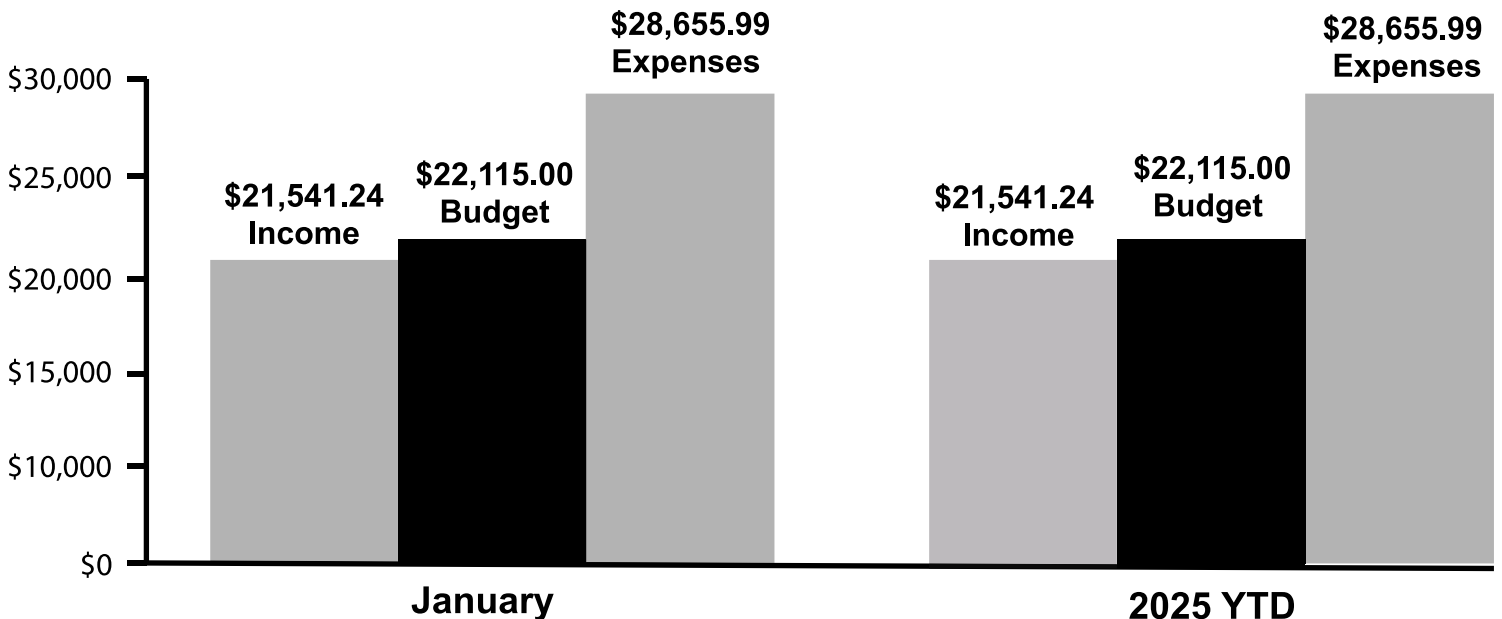


St. Luke YTD new building pledges VS. YTD pledge dollars received
