## **Pastor's Page**

Greetings in Christ St. Luke Lutheran Church,

I'm writing this newsletter article as we approach our Christmas program on December 8<sup>th</sup>. For the first time in my tenure at St. Luke, we're able to have our annual Christmas program in our own space. Our kids will tell Christ's story from our own chancel, their voices will reverberate around our own walls, and we'll be able to welcome guests into our own holy spaces. It's exciting, and honestly, it's made the weeks leading up to the program so much easier! I hope I don't sound like a broken record, but I want to offer my gratitude again for the hands that built our new tool for ministry (the building), for the Building Team who led the project and poured so much sweat equity into it, and for all our friends and members who contributed time, talents, and treasures to the build. I hope you enjoy celebrating Christ's birth as much as I will in our new holy spaces.

And, as we look around during the Christmas season and see new faces in our new building, let's remember those faces *ARE* the mission. Our holy call as Christians, as spoken in our baptismal promises (which we've heard a lot this year!), is to, "Proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace (ELW 227). All that holy work is done in relationship, and the new relationships we're forming each week gives us new, holy opportunities to do that good work. In fact, on December 21<sup>st</sup>, we're going to try something we haven't done before at St. Luke. We'll be hosting a "Longest Night" worship service (7pm). A "Longest Night" service is held on the winter solstice, during the darkest day of the year. It acknowledges that many people walk into Christmas holding more pain than joy, more loss than gain, and more grief than reasons to celebrate. During the "Longest Night" service we'll acknowledge God's presence in our dark places as a community, and we'll remember that God oftentimes does His best work in the dark. With that service on December 21<sup>st</sup> and our Christmas celebrations on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> we'll walk together through the *full breadth and depth* of what it means to be the people of God: we are people who walk with Jesus through the darkness into the light.

Finally, we approach the end of the year, a few folks have asked how they can make year-end gifts to our Forward In Faith Building Fund in order to continue fueling our new tool for ministry (the building). Year-end gifts, of course, have advantageous tax implications some hope to take advantage of. Here are a couple of tax-wise ways to give that might be of interest to many:

- Idea #1 If you are 70 1/2 or older and you have an IRA, you can avoid paying tax on your required withdrawals if you make a gift with those funds instead.
- Idea #2 If you own assets like stocks or mutual funds that have grown substantially in recent years, you can gift from those assets, and avoid paying the capital gains tax of a sale.
- Idea #3 If you need a way to reduce this year's tax bill, you can take a larger deduction by making a larger gift, and that gift ends up costing you less. Talk to your accountant about that.

If you'd like to learn more about any of these ways to make a gift that will bless the church, please reach out to Pr. Eric.

I already know that when that Christmas Program is over, I'll be full of gratitude for the dozens (maybe hundreds?) of hands and feet that contribute so much time and effort to telling Christ's story in this place. As a pastor, it's a joy and a pleasure always feeling like we're doing mission together, nobody is left to follow God's call on their own. Well done everyone. Merry Advent to all, and let's keep it up,





## Getting to know our members! Rick and Donna Buck's Interview for St. Luke

Rick remembers joining St. Luke when he was in the 4th grade (1970), prior to that his family attended Trinity Lutheran in Wanamingo. Donna was a member of Grace Lutheran before joining St. Luke in 1992 after her Mom passed away.

Donna's earliest memory here at St. Luke is that EVERYONE is welcome to partake in communion and the little ones receive a blessing. To this day Rick and Donna believe St. Luke is a place where we come together spiritually to grow in our faith and make and meet new /old friends. They do miss the children reciting memory work in front of the congregation and when Sunday school ended the children would go running to their parents and showing them the lesson they worked on. Now it is the music, singing and choir that hold special memories for them. So grateful for our talented soloist Michelle Matthees, Katie Schafer, Sara Strusz, Izzy, Aleaha and all others that sing. It's so powerful to listen in awe and rejoice that our church is filled with such musical talent.

When asked who was or what is the most profound or impactful memory or person from St. Luke, both Rick and Donna agreed Bryce Breuer had a great affect/influence on them. Finding out his favorite songs got them listening to the KTIS radio station. They also enjoyed when Arnie Stenlund would do the readings as "his voice would be truly captivating." Rick also remembers Chuck Munson being his Sunday school teacher. Rick and Craig Kurtti would talk about how easy it would be to be a pastor because you only have to work one day a week, throw something together for a sermon and that's it. Mr. Chuck Munson called them out on it and the whole class had to pick one of the Ten Commandments and do a sermon on it. A special service was held at Zion where they all had to deliver their sermon. That subject of becoming a pastor was never brought up again. That service at Zion could be why Rick and Donna both love the Sunrise and Christmas services held at rural Zion. As for confirmation classes Rick remembers walking to St. Luke on Wednesdays after school. He remembers Pastor Hasselquist as his teacher.

Rick's Grandma Eva was their spiritual mentor as she had an unwavering trust in God. She would read the bible every year, and did daily devotions. They also believe that all of our pastors have been good spiritual leaders in their own special ways. They really enjoyed Pastor Allen as he delivered his message/sermon he would start to sing part of a song. Pastor Eric is also a favorite of theirs, his sermons are understandable and always leaves you with a thought to ponder. He also did a beautiful grave side service for Mike (Rick's brother) whom Pastor Eric had never met but, was able to make it very touching for the family.

Rick and Donna are very grateful for our St. Luke church family. Because of all the talent, time and treasures along with the determination, sweat and commitments we have this new beautiful space to come together and worship. They believe that the legacy of St. Luke to be "The doors are always open and we welcome everyone to become a part of our faith filled church family."

## Giving to God "What I am Learning About Stewardship"

Part 3: Generous Gift Giving

Generous. What does it mean? The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines it as: liberal in giving, marked by abundance or ample proportions, and characterized by a noble or kindly spirit. When I think of the word generous, I also think of the word generosity, which is the fact of being generous or the act of being generous. We are surrounded by generous acts of generosity on a regular basis within our church community, the Goodhue community, and beyond. It's as simple as baking ample amount of the most delicious bars for fellowship after church to giving monetary church offerings to the Forward in Faith Fund and general fund to providing donations to the Food Shelf or the Blessing Barn. I see all these examples as an expression of love for others and God. People generally give with a generous heart with no expectation for anything in return. The gift giving in turn glorifies God as it showcases His character.

The Bible tells us that generosity isn't just about giving money or material things. It's about our willingness and desire to offer our time, talents, love and resources to help and benefit others. 2 Corinthians 9: 11-13 states this: "He will always make you rich enough to be generous at all times, so that many will thank God for your gifts which they receive from us. For this service you perform not only meets the needs of God's people, but also produces an outpouring of gratitude to God."

There are many generous givers in the Bible. In Genesis 18, Abraham was one of them. He had three visitors that came to him during a very hot day. He didn't just offer to give them a place to rest; he prepared a feast for them. This story reminds me of my neighbors growing up, Bertel and Evelyn. You could not visit them without being fed a entire meal. Evelyn would always insist that our family stay to have lunch or supper with them. When I think back to the several times this happened over the course of my childhood, Bertel and Evelyn were quite like Abraham with their outpouring of generosity and kindness.

In closing, the Bible reminds us we all have the opportunity to show generosity in many forms through time, talents, and treasures. We also have the opportunity to embrace and receive generous acts of others with a gracious heart.
