Finally, any kids or adults with mobility challenges didn't have to navigate stairs and drop-off/pick-up was super easy with one primary entrance and exit to the building. As I've said all along, our new building is a tool for ministry and it should help us achieve our mission of spreading Christ's story even more effectively. Well, that box can be checked. *Well done good and faithful servants*.

Second, I want to thank the volunteers who partnered in mission with us during Vacation Bible School. For the adults and teens who led groups and befriended the youngest among us, thank you for being the hands and feet of Christ so that words about Christ mean something when they settle on little ears. For those who worked in the background; purchasing food, making food, setting up, cleaning up, and more, thank you! Martha gets a bad wrap in scripture because she does all the background work while Mary sits at Jesus' feet, but let's remember, if somebody doesn't set the table, nobody eats! Thank you for preparing tables where God's grace could be encountered. *Well done good and faithful servants.*

And finally, I want to thank Nicole Wananda, our Sunday School Coordinator. Nicole works tirelessly behind the scenes and in front of the scenes making sure all the cats are herded, piles of supplies are where they need to be, and volunteers are equipped to do their good work. She does hundreds of things that are visibly awesome, and a hundreds more that we never see. *Well done good and faithful servant.*

Vacation Bible School week always serves as a microcosm for why St. Luke works as a church. This continues to be a place where God's people answer the call to participate together in mission to our community and beyond. And, you all do it with joy exuding from your hearts and hands. Keep it up, if all those kids at Vacation Bible School tell us anything it's that we have a bright future ahead. *Well done good and faithful servants.*



They also value a congregation with a feeling of community and fellowship, which they also found at St. Luke's. They love how the church, along with its members, work together to give everyone the best possible faith experience.

Rachel grew up and went to school in Hayfield, MN. She was a member of Trinity Lutheran in Hayfield, MN, where she was very involved in their youth group during her high school years and participated in service projects, a North Shore trip and attended the ELCA youth group gathering in Houston, Texas.
